

MOC-FLOYD VALLEY COMMUNITY SCHOOL - - - - November 12, 2018

The MOC-Floyd Valley Board of Education met on the above date at the Central Administration Office for its regular monthly meeting with all board members present. Also in attendance were Superintendent Adams, Secretary Dykstra, Principal Mulder, and the press.

The meeting was called to order at 5:03 p.m. by President Jager.

Motion was made by Kleinhesselink and supported by Immecker to approve the agenda as mailed. Motion carried unanimously.

- Open enrollment of Ethan Nelson out of the MOC-Floyd Valley Community School District into the Sioux Center Community School District for the 2018-19 school year for the next five years

Karina Nonnemacher and Ashley Van Voorst, school nurses, shared a report to the board about the health services that are provided throughout the district.

Principal Mulder gave a report on the high school. The board went up to the high school to hear from Sara Burmakow and some students from her forensics class.

Motion was made by Kleinhesselink, seconded by Reyes and carried unanimously to approve the following board policies as revised.

Superintendent Adams gave a progress report on the district foci, goals, and indicators.

A legislative update was given.

Superintendent Adams and Jack Bonnacroy, assistant technology/communications director, shared some potential communication options at the secondary level.

Information on the upcoming IASB convention was presented.

The first reading of Board Policies 203.5-203.9 was presented.

Motion was made by Kleinhesselink and supported by Immeker to approve the SBRC Application for increased enrollment in the amount of \$147,607.80 and LEP Instruction Beyond 5 years in the amount of \$37,240.50 for a grand total of \$184,848.30. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Kleinhesselink, supported by Koerselman to approve the purchase of 66 Chromebooks and 3 carts for a cost of \$22,836. This will help create a 2-1 ratio of devices at the K-3 level at Orange City Elementary. Motion carried unanimously.

During the 2018 legislative session, a law was passed that allows students who have attained proficiency in 2 or more languages, one of which is English, to receive an Iowa Seal of Biliteracy on their diplomas. Motion was made by Reyes and supported by Koerselman to approve adding the biliteracy seal on graduates' diplomas if they are proficient. Motion carried unanimously.
