## MOC-FLOYD VALLEY COMMUNITY SCHOOLS - - - - - September 21, 2020

The MOC-Floyd Valley Board of Education met on the above date at the central administration office for a special board meeting with all board members present. De Jong was present electronically. Also present were Superintendent Adams, Secretary Dykstra and the press.

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 a.m. by President Jager.

Motion was made by Reyes and supported by Kleinhesselink to approve the agenda as mailed. Motion carried unanimously.

President Jager announced that this is the time, place and date to hold a public hearing for the sale of the bus barn property. Since there were no objectors, the president declared the hearing closed.

Motion by Kleinhesselink, supported by Koerselman to approve the sale of the bus barn property to the City of Orange City for \$225,000. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Koerselman, supported by Reyes to approve the lease with OCDC for the building and property for a transportation facility for \$9,288 per month. Motion carried unanimously.

The Return to Learn plan was reviewed. Motion by Reyes, supported by De Jong to approve updates made to the plan. Motion carried unanimously. The changes made were:

- The use of the movie theater for high school classes so that student can be more socially distant
- Requiring high school and middle school students to wear masks in hallways and common areas when social distancing is not possible
- Requiring all students to wear masks on the school bus
- Game attendance guidelines for athletic events
