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Bus Information for Everyone

We are fortunate to have a team of drivers who are committed to transporting your children safely to and from school and school activities each day. We recognize how precious every student is, and want to make sure that we do all that we can to keep them safe – not only in school – but as they travel to and from school.

Below are a few things that parents and other drivers can do to help our drivers keep our students safe:

- 1) NEVER pass a stopped school bus while the stop-arm is extended from either direction! This happens more than one might think –both on school grounds and at route stops in town and rural roads. The fines are steep, and more importantly, lives are at stake!
- 2) NEVER drive through or park in the bus loading and unloading areas at the buildings during the restricted times. There is too much congestion and the visibility is far too dangerous!
- 3) If you need to communicate with a driver, contact the school office or district office and the message will be relayed to the driver via radio. Drivers have been instructed not to allow anyone other than student passengers on to the bus. They have also been instructed not to stop and visit with anyone other than student passengers while transporting students.

We also try to clearly communicate student expectations while riding the school bus. Parents, please review these rules and expectations with your children and encourage them ride safely and respectfully!

MOC-Floyd Valley Community School District Bus Rules & Expectations


A safe, orderly, and respectful environment for everyone is the expectation on the school bus. Whenever students are riding a school bus, whether on a regular route each day or on a field trip, they are responsible to follow these rules. Parents are urged to encourage good bus riding habits so that the driver may direct his or her attention to the surrounding traffic and to safe loading and unloading procedures.

- 1. To ensure safety, the driver must be totally in charge. Students must respond promptly when instructions are given.
- 2. Students are asked to be quiet when the bus stops at railroad tracks.
- 3. Animals, oversized objects, glass containers, or any inappropriate materials (i.e. tobacco and related material, alcohol, and other prohibited items) are not allowed on the bus, as designated by School Board Policy.
- 4. Students must observe classroom and school-wide expectations as covered by the Student Handbook. Ordinary conversation is permitted. Horseplay, unruly behavior, fighting, abusive and obscene language or gestures are unacceptable. Kicking, hitting, pushing, spitting, yelling or screaming, littering or other inappropriate behaviors are forbidden on the bus, just as they are at school or on the school grounds.
- 5. Students must keep feet, backpacks, book bags and other items within the seating areas at all times. As much as possible, the aisles and stairwell must be clear of items and objects at all times.
- 6. All body parts must be kept inside the bus window at all times.
- 7. Students must remain seated in the same seat until they are dropped off at their bus stops. Moving about the bus while it is in motion is unsafe and unacceptable. A student must move out of a seat promptly if requested to do so by the driver or monitor.
- 8. Students will use the emergency door only in cases of emergency.
- 9. If a student causes damage to the bus, parents will be expected to pay for that damage.
- 10. Regular schedules must be observed. The bus will not wait for tardy students. Students must be at the bus stop 5 minutes before the scheduled pick up time.
- 11. Students should get on and off the bus only at their designated stops.
- 12. For safety reasons, students should not take pictures on the school bus. The resulting flash can be a hazard to the driver's vision.
- 13. Failure to follow these rules may result in a range of consequences up to and including suspension from transportation.

Cameras have been installed and are utilized to maintain order and safety on our buses.

How to Place a Hold on School Library Materials

4) Click on Log In.




5) Log in using your school user name (eg. 20josmit) and password.

Here's a brief descriptor of the resources

eBooks/Literature

- **BookFlix** targets students in grades PK-3. BookFlix pairs fictional storybooks with related nonfiction books. BookFlix also has 36 pairs of titles available in Spanish. Students can read the books independently or choose to have the books read to them. Lesson plans, assessment activities, and related web sites are included.
- TrueFlix is similar in format to BookFlix, but targets an older audience (grades 3-6). Books are nonfiction and have content in both social studies and science with accompanying resources. Again, students can read the books independently or have the books read to them.
- FreedomFlix targets students in grades 4 and up. FreedomFlix provides content about **United States history**, but recently added content on **ancient cultures** as well. All the eBooks include related content. Educator resources include lesson plans, writing prompts and whiteboard activities. Again, books can be read independently or books can be read to students.
- MackinVia is an online portal that makes it easy to access eBooks and audiobooks that have been purchased by Northwest AEA. MackinVia eBooks and audiobooks can also be read and listened to on tablets, mobile devices and smartphones by downloading the free MackinVia app.

- Cybersmarts and Teen Cybersmarts: Each collection has five interactive books designed to teach students about staying safe online. Lesson plans, reproducibles and research prompts are included. Both also provide users with a simulated online experience.
- **TeachingBooks.net** includes thousands of teaching resources about fiction and nonfiction books used in K-12. Resources include, meet the author video interviews, book readings, book guides, lesson plans, book trailers, and websites.

Reference/Research

- Britannica Digital Learning is available for students in PK-12. Britannica makes it extremely easy to differentiate content because it's possible to adjust reading levels without changing the interface. Britannica is perfect for student research and project based learning. Britannica has two Spanish encyclopedias available: Enciclopedia Moderna and Escolar Online. The Annals of American History is a great source for primary source documents.
- CultureGrams includes a Kids', World, Provinces and States Edition. CultureGrams provides a perspective on daily life and culture, including the history, customs and lifestyles of the world's people. Content can be downloaded to Google Drive.
- Gale provides reliable content from magazines, newspapers and reference materials. Content is available for all grade levels. *Download content to your Google Drive or Microsoft 365*.
- ScienceFlix focuses on subject-area science content for students spanning grades 4-9. ScienceFlix offers 50 complete units of scientific study and each unit offers videos for building background knowledge, nonfiction articles written at three reading levels and in Spanish, read-aloud features, hands-on experiments, careers section, news stories, vetted weblinks, and educator resources.
- SIRS ® Issues Researcher delivers the pros and cons on today's complex social issues through full-text articles, multimedia, primary sources, government documents and reference material. SIRS R Issues Researcher also provides many useful educator and student tools to make research easier. *Content can also be downloaded to Google Drive*.
- Teen Health and Wellness provides nonjudgmental, straightforward information on today's teen health and wellness issues. This can be integrated with Google Drive and articles can be saved to Google Drive.

Digital Media:

- AEA Digital Library has digital curriculum resources from leading producers of PK-12 content. This collection includes streaming video, still images, and digital documents for Pre K-3 children's literature, 4-8th grade science, 7-12th grade health and guidance, and the AIME copyright newsletter.
- iCLIPART.com contains over 7.8-million royalty-free clipart images, photos, web graphics, animations, fonts and sounds. Use iCLIPART.com images in Web sites, newsletters, brochures, advertisements, announcements, signs -- virtually any graphic design project you can think of!
- Learn360 is a library of educational videos, video clips, and images. Learn360's newest offering are interactives. You can easily find these by doing an advanced search.

Dear Parent(s) and Guardian(s),

Throughout your child's time at MOC-Floyd Valley, it is imperative that school/home communication is timely and effective. I am relatively new to this position, however, that doesn't lessen my passion to maximize students learning by creating a healthy environment with quality care. By providing this quality health care, it is our hope that all students will be able to achieve more.

The following suggestions are intended to help you make the fullest possible contribution to your child's success at school.

Regular and punctual attendance is a great factor in school success. Please have your child attend school every day and be on time. Allowing children to stay home unnecessarily makes it more difficult for them to succeed because they are constantly playing catchup. Poor attendance encourages poor attitudes towards future work and obligations.

Keep us informed of any conditions including:

- Medications that your child is taking, or needs to take at school. These include both prescription or over the counter medications.
- Fractures, casts, crutches, stitches, splints; if your child is unable to participate in recess or PE, please send a doctor's note.
- Contagious conditions
- Results of any follow-up tests
